The Season of Lent and Easter

"Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things, but few things are needed—indeed only one. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her." – Luke 10:41-42

Holy Week is finally here! After wandering through the wilderness of Lent, we are about to reach the promised land of Easter. However, there is still so much to see and to do. In the church, this is the busiest week of the year.
