From Your Minister - Christian Smith

"For it is the God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness', who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ." – 2 Corinthians 4:6

This past Sunday we celebrated Easter Sunday. Most years, as a part of that celebration, we read the story of Mary Magdalene and her encounter with someone she believed to be a gardener. Of course, we know that the man she was speaking with was Jesus. It wasn't until he said her name that she recognized her messiah. This Sunday, we will read the story of the disciples who met Jesus on the road to Emmaus. Again, though they had spent a great deal of time with Jesus, they failed to recognize Christ as they walked alongside him. It was not until Jesus broke bread with them that they realized they were in the presence of their friend and savior.

We are promised that we will never be left alone. We are promised that the resurrected Christ will always be with us. Yet, sometimes, it is difficult for us to recognize Him in our lives and the world around us. Mary and the Emmaus disciples were so wrapped up in their grief and their confusion, that they could not see the good news happening in their lives. Often, we get so wrapped up in the bad news of the world or the things that are happening in the lives of others, that we fail to see the good news of Christ that is bursting forth right in front of us. It is still Easter. Jesus is still alive and is still seeking to reveal himself to us. We just have to decide if we are going to allow ourselves to have the eyes to see him.
