From Your Minister - Christian Smith

"Why do you pass judgment on your brother or sister? Or you, why do you despise your brother or sister? For we will all stand before the judgment seat of God."

- 2 Corinthians 4:6

On Monday, several people in our community went outside and watched a near-total solar eclipse. I have seen pictures from many within our church as they donned their special glasses and stared at the sky to enjoy God's light show. While several of us enjoy the beauty of this event, others believe that this event, which happens every 1 to 3 years somewhere around the globe, is a sign of the end of the world or a sign of God's judgment on America.

I have noticed that when people see signs that they believe point to God's judgment, that judgment is always directed at someone else. Whenever people feel as if God's judgment is warranted, rarely is that judgment directed to themselves. Instead, often, we seem to believe that the people who will be judged are those who are different from us or those whose ideas or ideals are different from ours.

We are all being called to repentance. We are being called to change and to draw ourselves closer to God. Instead of waiting for God to punish our neighbors, we ought to be more focused on how we can bring more honor to the Kingdom of God. Perhaps we ought to stop looking to the sky and waiting for God to punish those in front of us, and instead, look to the people in front of us and help point them to a loving God.
