God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult. – Psalm 46:1-3

As I sit in my office and look outside my windows, it is beginning to look eerily dark. At 8am it is supposed to be bright outside, but I can barely see East 10th Street this morning. Storms are on the way and the threat of storms is present all day and much of the night. Unfortunately, many of us in this area are highly familiar with the destruction these storms can bring. Thankfully, we also know the precautions we need to take to prepare ourselves before the storms arrive and we know what to do to try to protect ourselves during the storms.


STEWARDSHIP REPORT for Sunday, May 5, 2024
