 If you heard Christian's message this past Sunday morning, you might have caught that our church opened the first licensed day care in Cookeville - Cumberland Presbyterian Nursery School. Our nursery school has been in operation for over 35 years.



- We currently serve 48 children ranging in age from six weeks to schoolage. We are open 6:30 AM to 5:30 PM Monday through Friday. We have
 12 full-time employees and 8 part-time employees. Children receive breakfast, lunch and one snack each day.
- We strive to provide a safe, loving environment for children to meet age-appropriate learning goals using a Christian-based curriculum. Think about how many children we have been able to reach over the years. This is truly one of the great ministries of our church.
