I, like many of you, watched the presidential debate last night. Afterward, I made a huge mistake. Because once the televised debate was finished, I tuned into the social media debate. "She's just rambling and lying constantly... Do your research!" "He's just rambling and lying constantly... Do your research!" "I am so glad that my candidate is a real, genuine person and not a fraud like the opponent." It is a pretty sad state of affairs to see just how divided we are.

Politics has become a battleground of dishonesty. Social media especially is filled with stories, pictures, and memes that are often false. Yet, because they support the narrative of our chosen candidate, we share them freely with everyone and tell the stories that we bother to verify as truth.

As your pastor, I will never tell you for whom you should or should not vote. I encourage you to vote and to be involved in the political process. However, I encourage you to show your support for your candidate with honesty and truth. Expect your candidate to be honest. As people of faith, we are called to walk in the truth. Honesty and truth ought to guide our religious lives, our daily lives, and our political lives.

Men's Tuesday Bible Study


