For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God - not the result of works, so that no one may boast. — Ephesians 2:8-9



This Sunday, we will be celebrating Reformation Sunday. Each year, we remember that on October 31, 1517, Martin Luther nailed his "Ninety-Five Theses" on the door of the All Saints' Church in Wittenberg, Germany. We celebrate this event as the beginning of the Protestant Reformation, a movement that affirmed that the Bible, with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, is the authority for matters of faith and that authority does not lie with human positions. The Reformation movement also sought to remind the people that salvation is by God's grace and by faith in Jesus Christ

and to move away from the idea of works-based salvation that had become popular.

While Martin Luther is the name that is mentioned most often, there were numerous reformers who argued against the oppression and the poor theology that they were seeing from the church at that time. John Calvin, Ulrich Zwingli, John Knox, and John Wycliffe are just a few of the more well-known reformers. However, there were countless others who chose to stand for their beliefs and called for the church to reexamine and reform its teachings.

While some may not get credit, and others may have been forgotten by history, thankfully, the reformers did not work for personal recognition. Instead, they worked to help the church better serve people and better bring glory to the Kingdom of God. Their work and dedication to the kingdom of God is something from which we still benefit over 500 years later. More importantly, while we may not know their names, God does. Let's continue doing the work of reforming our church, our community, and our own lives. People may not always recognize the good that we are doing, but God sees us and seeks to guide us. If we follow God's path, then the work we do will make an impact for years to come.


STEWARDSHIP REPORT for Sunday, October 20, 2024
