Lift up your heads, O gates! and be lifted up, O ancient doors!
that the King of glory may come in.
Who is the King of glory? The Lord, strong and mighty,
the Lord, mighty in battle.— Psalm 24:7-8

This Sunday is Reign of Christ or Christ the King Sunday. This Sunday, which is the last of the Christian year, allows us to celebrate the ultimate victory of our Lord and Savior. During the last 12 months, we have walked through celebrations of the liturgical church year. We walked through the season of Advent as we prepared for the arrival of our King. We have walked through the season of Lent as we prepared our hearts for the sacrifice of our king. We have walked through the events of Easter and celebrated our king's victory at the resurrection. As we approach this Sunday, we have the opportunity for reflection, thanksgiving, and preparation.

The end of the Christian year invites us to pause and reflect on how we have grown in faith over the last 12 months. How well have we embodied the love of Christ in our service to others? Have we deepened our relationship with God? These questions are not meant to make us feel guilty but are intended to guide us as we prepare to welcome the opportunities of a new liturgical year with renewed hearts and minds.

The end of the Christian year also provides us with the opportunity to remember that Christ is not a distant ruler but a loving and constant presence in our lives. Christ continues to seek to remind us of his grace and compassion for us. We are invited to celebrate and offer praise for the light that Christ continues to shine into our lives.

The church year is drawing to a close. Next week we will begin our march through a new year as we begin the season of Advent. As we do so, let's remember who Christ has been for us and how we can make the next step in our walk for Him in the new year.


