From Your Minister - Christian Smith

- Matthew 5:16

On Saturday, our church session will be meeting to have their annual retreat. During this retreat, the session will examine how our congregation might better serve one another, our community, and the Kingdom of God.

In preparation for the retreat, I sent a survey to the members of the session with a series of questions about the status of our church. One of the questions I ask the session each year is, "If we were to ask people in our community what this church is known for, what would their response be?"

That is an important question for our church and each of us individually. The answer I received from several members of our leadership is that we are known as the "church in the woods" or the "church with the cross in the window." While those are important characteristics of our facilities, that is not enough. If that is all we are known for, then we are only known for existing. People need to know more about us. But we have to show them what we want them to know about us. Personally, I would much rather our church be known for what we are doing for God and for others.

Likewise, as people of faith, each of us needs to ask what we as individuals are known for. Are we simply existing or do people recognize us as being people of love, compassion, mercy, and service? Are we doing all that is necessary for people to see those characteristics in us?


<u>Liturgists for Sunday Services</u>
