From Your Minister - Christian Smith

"Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action." - I John 3:18

During my sermon on Sunday, I began by asking the congregation, "What is the most powerful word in the English language?" During both services, someone from the pews stated that they believed that it was "love." I wish that the word "love" was the most powerful. As I said in my sermon on Sunday, "Love is intimate. It is meaningful. Love is a reminder of what we are called to do. But it is not as powerful as it could be because we all have different ideas of what love should look like."

Love would be more powerful if we did not add so many exceptions to our love. "I love you, but you need to act more like me." "I love you, but I cannot accept what you believe." I would love them, but they don't look like me." We seemingly seek to restrict who is worthy of our love. As we said Sunday, anything before the word "but" is nonsense.

As we approach Valentine's Day and the celebration of love, let us remember that God gave us the parable of the Good Samaritan to remind us of who it is we should love. From that parable, we learn that we are called to love not the few people close to us but all people. If we want "love" to really be one of the most powerful words in the world, we must stop putting restrictions on our love. Just love all people. No ifs, ands, or buts about it.
