From Your Minister - Christian Smith

"Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." — Philippians 4:6

Most of you know that every Tuesday we open the doors of the church to offer utility and food assistance to members of our community. Yesterday, we saw far more people than we have seen in a long time. It is always a blessing to see the joy on the faces of those whose burdens are lifted, even just a little.

After assistance was over, I had the opportunity to go and visit with one of the members of our church who is no longer able to be with us on Sunday mornings. We had a great time talking about the church and life. Our time together brought joy to both of us. There was so much good in the day yesterday.

But if I am honest, it was not the joy that stuck with me all day. It was the hurt. In the middle of all that joy, one person came for assistance, and we were unable to help her. She became very upset with me. Even though we made many people happy, it was that one difficult moment that I kept replaying throughout the day.

I think that's true for many of us. We sometimes hold onto the criticism or the conflict more tightly than we hold onto the blessings that we are offered. In those moments, prayer is not just a discipline. It is a lifeline. Prayer invites us to place all of our joy and the pain, our gratitude and frustration, everything into God's hands.

Prayer keeps us from carrying the weight of every moment of life by ourselves. God sees and cares about our joys, pains, and frustrations. Prayer shows our trust that God can carry the burden and help to realign our heart and our vision for the days ahead.

As we continue to focus on the importance of prayer, I invite you to bring every moment to God. Bring Him the good moments, the frustrating ones, and everything in between. God is big enough to handle it all, and through prayer, God gives us the peace we cannot give ourselves.
